

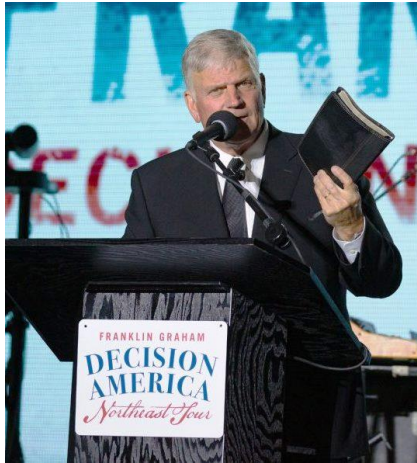

Franklin Graham Preaches in Springfield Area By Roberta D'Amico



May 25th, 2019, was a life-changing day for many in the Springfield area. Almost 6000 people (or more) came out that evening to the Eastern States Exposition grounds to hear Franklin Graham preach.

It was an enthusiastic crowd that listened to Graham expound on the book of John, chapter 3, about the Jewish leader named Nicodemus who had come to see Jesus. Just as Jesus said 2000+ years ago, Graham asked if his audience realized that time was

running out, but they could have a new start, be "born again."

Like many of us, Nicodemus was religious, but did not have a personal relationship with God. After Graham explained that Jesus is the answer, how He came from heaven to save us, died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins, rose again to life, and is with us here tonight, he then asked people to put their faith in Jesus, ask for forgiveness, and invite Him into their life. Possibly 600 stood to their feet to indicate their decision and were met by counselors.

A mother brought her 13 year old daughter, who stood up and accepted Christ. "You have Someone who has your back," the mother said. "Now you have Someone Who loves you no matter what, . . . and God is your Rock!"

The turn-out was better than expected, so much so that there

was not space for people to come forward, so the counselors went to them. They prayed with those who responded and took their names for follow-up, passing their information on to area churches.

I asked Pastor Adams, who has been very supportive, having hosting the pre-crusade meetings at Bethany Church, "how do you think the Crusade will impact Springfield?" He said that it depends on the follow-up.

He remarked that follow-up is critically important, and that the Crusade is just a "touch point," it's the follow up that is necessary. So if your church is participating in follow up from the Crusade, please be diligent to fulfill your commitment to contact them. Call them, invite them, reach out to them. And to all of you, I'm asking that you remember them in prayer!

Update on Coffee House II

Plans are moving forward slowly to make the vision of Coffee House II a reality! Of course, in God's mind it is already a reality, but we need to cloth it in brick and steel! That is where you and I come into the picture.
