The Meaning of Jewish Holidays

Pastor Scott and Pastor Jonathan have in the past few years given us wonderful teaching on the Jewish holidays and we are blessed to have these teachings and inspiring examples of God's messages to us. The 7 major holidays are symbolic of the most important events in the first and second comings of Christ, but some of the other minor holidays are valuable also.

The very next holiday on the calendar is Purim, which falls on March 5 this year. Purim comes 30 days before Passover, April 3rd, the evening of Good Friday. Traditionally, Purim is celebrated with reading and reenactment of the story of Esther, a big feast, and giving to charity and neighbors.

Purim is a holiday which is fun to celebrate. Pastor Jonathan says, "It is somewhat like a Jewish Halloween, because the children dress up in costumes. They act out the story of Hadassah, or Esther, in the Bible." Mordecai and Esther, his young cousin, had been taken captive with many other Jews, to Babylon. King Ahasuerus was tricked into passing a law to destroy all the Jewish people in his vast empire and it seemed like all was lost. Then, God caused the King to remember that Mordecai had once saved his life, giving Queen Esther opportunity to go before the King with favor and save the Jewish nation. Once again, the devil's plot to annihilate God's people was thwarted and the Messianic line was preserved.

This event illustrates the providence of God. He is always working, and His providence is always active, even when we are not aware of it. It only seems that sometimes God has forgotten us. We can always trust God to help, but like Queen Esther, we must be obedient.

Soon after Purim comes the 4 Spring Festivals, beginning with the Passover. Passover and the two "feasts" following celebrate the deliverance of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt, an event that is symbolic of our salvation and deliverance from our sin and the consequences of it. This year, as last year, the Jewish holidays have a special feature, the "Tetrad", four Blood Moons (lunar eclipses) and two solar eclipses, which fall exactly on the Biblical Feasts of Passover and Tabernacles in 2014 and 2015. This phenomenon is so rare it has occurred only 3 times in the last 500 years, and each time was related to significant events in Jewish history, making the Jewish Feast Days instructive of our Almighty God and prophetic for our future.
