Following the ring ceremony, the bride and groom offered each other the “right hand of fellowship” symbolizing how important it is to be friends before becoming husband and wife. Pray that they will always remain friends through all the joys and stresses of life. After the wedding, the new couple took off for a few days away.

hear the music, and enjoy the coffee and snacks. Jesse led, accompanied by his girlfriend Jazmine, also

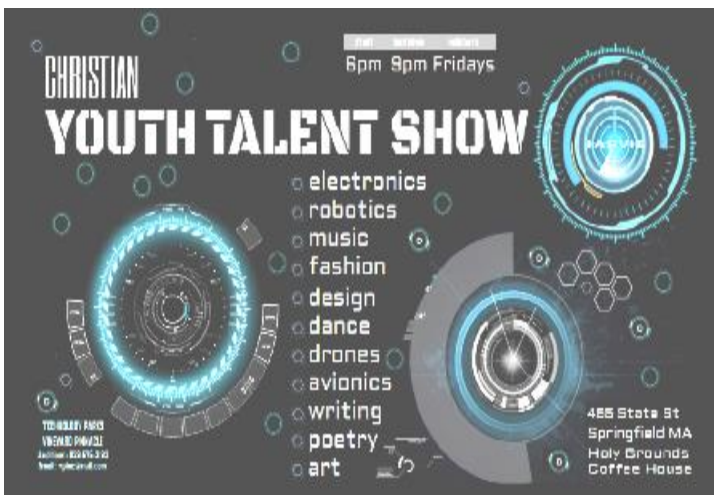
