Hector Vega Comes to Springfield



He was born and grew up in New York City. Even though Hector Vega had a mom and a dad, a home and siblings who cared about him, the life on the streets of New York almost completely ruined his life. It was only the grace and mercy of God that saved him, turned his life around, and sent him out to preach Jesus in jails and churches! Hence, on Friday night, September 16, 2022, Hector came to speak to a crowd of 60 or so at Calvary’s Love Church.

Calvary’s Love Church is a beautiful building which was originally a Jewish Synagogue. Juan Feliciano is the pastor here, and also a Board Member of the Redemption Gate Mission Society. He began the meeting by introducing the “Three

Treasures” that we all seek after. The whole world is seeking after them! They are: the Peace that passes understanding; Joy unspeakable; and Love incomparable. Pastor Juan said that if you don’t have these yet, you will be invited tonight to receive them!

After Eddie Case, director of the prison ministry at Ludlow Jail, prayed, Denise Ridley, a chaplain at Ludlow, introduced Hector Vega. Hector Vega has an amazing story to tell of God’s might power, grace and mercy. It began in Hell’s Kitchen in New York City where he grew up, in an incredibly dysfunctional neighborhood. That was followed by years in Harlem where dealing drugs led him in and out of prison. The devil had him where he wanted him, doing drugs, stealing, swindling; but there is a God in heaven!

He met a girl and she took him to church – where he met David Wilkerson. There a group committed to pray for him. Soon after, he agreed to go to a drug program in Newark, New Jersey. In 1996, he raised his hands in surrender to God and was saved, healed of his addictions, filled with the Holy Spirit!

His message to us that night, in brief, was simple but profound! He said that when we speak, it must be in the power of God, not our own message, but God’s. The Lord must take control of every word. He asked, “Do you really want to know what God is saying?” Many, even in the church, really don’t, because then they’d be responsible. It is no different today than in the days of the Israelites (Isaiah 30:9), “They are a rebellious people ... who do not want to listen to the Lord’s instruction. This group of people, God’s people, wanted alliances with the world!” Vega said.

He said that the problem is two-fold: we are trying to become something we already are, and we are trying to get something we already have! As Christians, we are sons and daughters of the Father, we are victorious. We have the indwelling presence and power of God; we have the peace and joy and love of Christ. Love must express itself. We are the object of His love, a channel for His love to pass on to others, if only we would lay down self and let Him do something wonderful in our hearts. Then we will have a testimony of His grace and love. There is nothing you can do to make God love you more that He does, neither is there anything you do that will cause Him to love you less. But you have only to believe it! This wonderful meeting closed with many going forward for prayer. We pray that they will seek to know the fullness of God’s power, faith, and love in their lives.
