We shared literature with them and prayer for them. Throughout the evening Christian bands played music; much of it was in Spanish, which attracted a large crowd! It was a good opportunity to work together, eat together, and worship together across ethnic lines! Fifth Sunday Unity Service at Pastor Cooley's United Temple Church By Roberta D'Amico

On July 30, 2023, the 5th Sunday in July, the Body of Church met for the Trust Jesus Unity Service where Christians from many different denominations and ethnic groups met to worship God together. Many pastors were there with believers from several ethnic groups for the sole purpose of lifting up praise to God! As host, Pastor Cooley secured the vacant lot across the street for the large tent, leaving his church parking lot at 191 Walnut Street for the cars. It was good to have this event here, because Pastor Cooley says our job here in Springfield is to claim this neighborhood for Christ Jesus.



Before the Service, hot food was available to the workers, helpers, and anyone there: chicken and hotdogs cooked by Sam. Shortly after five o'clock, all the leaders and workers who made this wonderful event possible gathered in a circle to pray, then the band began worship music.

The main speaker was Pastor Skip Gunn of LifeStream Church in Hampden MA. He addressed the Worship Team, but spoke this message to all of us: What made this music great was that each one of the team used their gift from God to lead us to worship! The Holy Spirit wants to work through your mind, will, and emotions to lead each one out of confusion to peace! Pastor Gunn says, "Say NO to the spirit of discouragement! Each one of us is an important part of the Body of Christ!" Then prayer was raised up that we would look to the Lord, His power and might, instead of getting fixated on our difficulties. "Mental health problems can cripple us, but Jesus can overcome them!"



We heard some awesome testimonies, especially from a young man, Cesar Adorno. He told us that he came from a Christian family and was raised in the church, but after taking Percocet for a medical problem, he became addicted. It became a long struggle, but after waking up from 12 overdoses, someone took him to a Christian Rehab. There the pastor prayed with him for healing, and God, through the healing of the Blood of Christ, set him free! Here is his picture, with his daughter.
