1 Peter 2:9 (KJV) 9" But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light;

There are things that we are ashamed to share with others, things from our pasts that we would like to keep there. We don't want others to know about the decisions we made and their negative outcomes. We don't want people knowing that we weren't always full of the Spirit of God, that perhaps there was at one time a liquid spirit driving us. We weren't embarrassed when we were out there living it, but we're embarrassed now. We don't want to be associated with the person we once were. Yet, it is the person we once were that gives us a testimony. It is that person who came to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. It is that former person that was changed by the power of the blood of Jesus...washed and made whole. That person, the one we're so ashamed of, is the one who was brought out of darkness and into God's marvelous light.

So now we are a chosen generation! Now we are a royal priesthood! Now we are an holy nation! Now

we are a peculiar people and now we should show forth the praises of Him who called us out of that darkness and into His marvelous light. We don't need to be ashamed of who we were, but we need to be shouting and praising about who we are NOW! We have a reason to rejoice, we have a story to tell about how we were lost but have been found. We have a testimony to tell about how we used to be messed up, but God loved us, cleaned us up, and claimed us as His sons and daughters.
